Week 10– Resurrection Promised *Ezekiel 37:3-5*
The Valley of Dry Bones

1. Jeremiah 31:31-34 contains the promise of the New Covenant. What is the connection between the Jeremiah 31 and Ezekiel 36 and 37 (The valley of dry bones)?
 - a. What is “new” about the New Covenant?

2. What are some points of continuity and discontinuity in the Old Covenant and the New Covenant?

3. What was the condition of the people of Israel during the time of Ezekiel? Ezekiel 37:11 helps answer that question. How does this shape our appreciation for the prophecy?
 - a. Recall that Ezekiel was living during the Babylonian deportation sometime around 590-585 b.c.
 - b. Although the Israel of Ezekiel’s day could not comprehend the idea of resurrection, what can we learn from this passage about the doctrine of resurrection?

4. What is the significance of the “breath” references throughout Ezekiel 37?
 - a. What can we learn about the ministry of the Holy Spirit?
